FAQ

The table below outlines the responses to questions were asked by parents/carers on during this event.

Question	Response
<p>How can students contact their parents/carers on 'double exam' days if their phones are in mobile phone lockers?</p>	<p>If a student needs to contact a parent/carer during these 'double exam days', they can do so via reception or the pastoral team. Mobile phones must be kept locked in students' phone lockers during this time.</p> <p>If a student leaves site, their locker will be unlocked for them to make contact.</p> <p>Once a student returns to site, their mobile phone must be placed back in their mobile phone locker.</p> <p>To be clear, mobile phones must be in phone lockers at all times when Year 11 students are on site during the exam period.</p>
<p>Are students expected to memorise exam seat numbers?</p>	<p>It is very helpful if students know their seat numbers before they arrive at exams. It helps us to undertake our registration and exam entrance procedures as smoothly as possible, reducing stress and anxiety for all students involved.</p> <p>The seat numbers for each exam are published on a display in the courtyard each day for those that require a reminder.</p>
<p>Year 13 students have been told to attend lessons in subjects that have not yet been examined – even after the 1 June. Is this the case?</p>	<p>Year 13 teachers will be available during these lessons, meaning that should a Year 13 students wish to attend their timetabled lessons, they are welcome to do so.</p> <p>Should they have an exam at the time of their normal lesson, the exam will obviously take precedent.</p>
<p>Will content guides be produced for the final GCSE Exams like they are for AP1 and AP2?</p>	<p>No – students should utilise the information in the subject curriculum map on the school website, or the subject specifications from each exam board website.</p> <p>Ultimately, any of the subject content they have learned since the start of Year 10/Year 12 could be tested in their GCSE/A-Level subjects.</p>
<p>Do interventions continue to run during the examinations?</p>	<p>Morning interventions will cease to take place from Friday 22 May.</p> <p>After school interventions may continue to run during study leave (from Monday 1 June), however this will be determined by each HOD. The process to sign up to these sessions will remain the same, through School Cloud.</p>
