Attendance and Punctuality


If a student had:

- Paper 1 (Non – Calculator)
- Paper 2 and 3 (Calculator)
- Each paper 1hour 30mins
- Two Tiers – Higher and Foundation
- Higher (Level 4 to level 9)
- Foundation (Level 1 to level 5)
- Higher – Some A level topics introduced into the new GCSE (e.g graphing quadratic inequalities, rationalising SURDs with conjugates, lots of proofs)
- General theme – problem solving

GCSE Science

Trilogy

- E, N, D, P & S
- 6 exams (2 Bio/2 Chem/ 2 Phys)
- 1hour 15min long exams
- Grades 5:5 or 5:6 or 6:6 etc
- All foundation OR higher
 - Foundation 1-5
 - Higher 4-9
- AQA recommend that students taking higher papers have to also take higher Maths.

Triple

- W
- 6 exams (2 Bio/2 Chem/ 2 Phys)
- 1hour 45min long exams
- 3 separate grades eg 7, 8, 7



GCSE Science

Required Practical's

- Carry out 21 practical's
- Practical's assessed in exam (~25%)
- Questions could assess
 - Apparatus and techniques
 - Methods
 - Risk assessments
 - Results
 - Analysis- graphs and conclusions
 - Application to a further experiment
- Practical's may be applied to a different context.

Maths

- 10% Biology paper
- 20% Chemistry paper
- 30% Physics paper

Physics Equations

- 21 or 23 equations to LEARN
- 8 or 12 equations to USE



GCSE Science

Pupils will have covered all aspects of the GCSE by the end of this term.

The rest of the year is used for targeted revision.





THE MEMORY CLOCK








How to revise

Three common techniques that are ineffective in helping you revise:

- Highlighting textbooks and revision guides
- Re-reading notes
- Summarising textbooks and revision guides

Use these techniques instead...

1. Flash cards
2. Transform it into graphic organisers
3. Dual coding – pictures and words
4. Cornell notes
5. Deliberate practice
6. The big picture
7. Interleaving and spacing
